As I was pondering some words to share with you, I decided to step away from the cacophony of election news distracting me from my work in order to go for a quiet, afternoon walk. The autumn hues seemed especially startling and vibrant—explosive reds, varied golds, blazing and rusty oranges—made me wonder if somehow I had not paid attention to their beauty in recent years. The community garden in my neighborhood has already produced a remarkable harvest, flowers clustered around the fences fading now to crisp browns.

Intention for Giving—Pastor Barbara

As the Finance team begins to budget for 2023, our church leadership asks that each one of us prayerfully consider our giving for the coming year. We often talk about the “tithes” or the goal of setting aside ten percent of one’s income as the biblical guideline for giving to the work of God through your local church. Tithing is giving back to God a portion of what God has given us. And giving can also grow our faith as we trust God to provide for all our needs so that we can see our community of faith grow spiritually, drawing more people to follow Jesus. Our ASK is this:

- Take an “Intention for Giving” card home and pray over it.
- Figure out what percentage of income you are giving now.
- If you never thought about being intentional before—could you please pray about it and be intentional?
- If you are giving 1 percent of your income—could you manage 2 percent?
- If you are at 5 percent, could you go for 6 percent?
- Could you trust God to provide for your needs?
- Whatever you do is between you and God, we just ask that you pray and please be intentional.
- Please help with our budget planning for 2023 by handing in the card by November 20.
- Pray that together, we can close the gap between our incoming funds and expenses.
- Be watching for God’s surprises and blessings!

Christmas Outreach Food Baskets—Deanne Gade

Once again, we will partner with the Easton School district to provide 60 food baskets to families of need. Starting Sunday, October 30th, we will have bags with the list of items to purchase for you to sign up to help with this project. The average cost to fill the bag is about \$25. If you do not want to shop to fill the bag, you can donate cash and the Missions team will shop for the items. If you want to donate funds to purchase the items, you can place your donation in an envelope on Sunday morning or mail it to the church with the notation of Christmas Basket.

The filled bags are due to back to the church on Sunday, November 20th.
